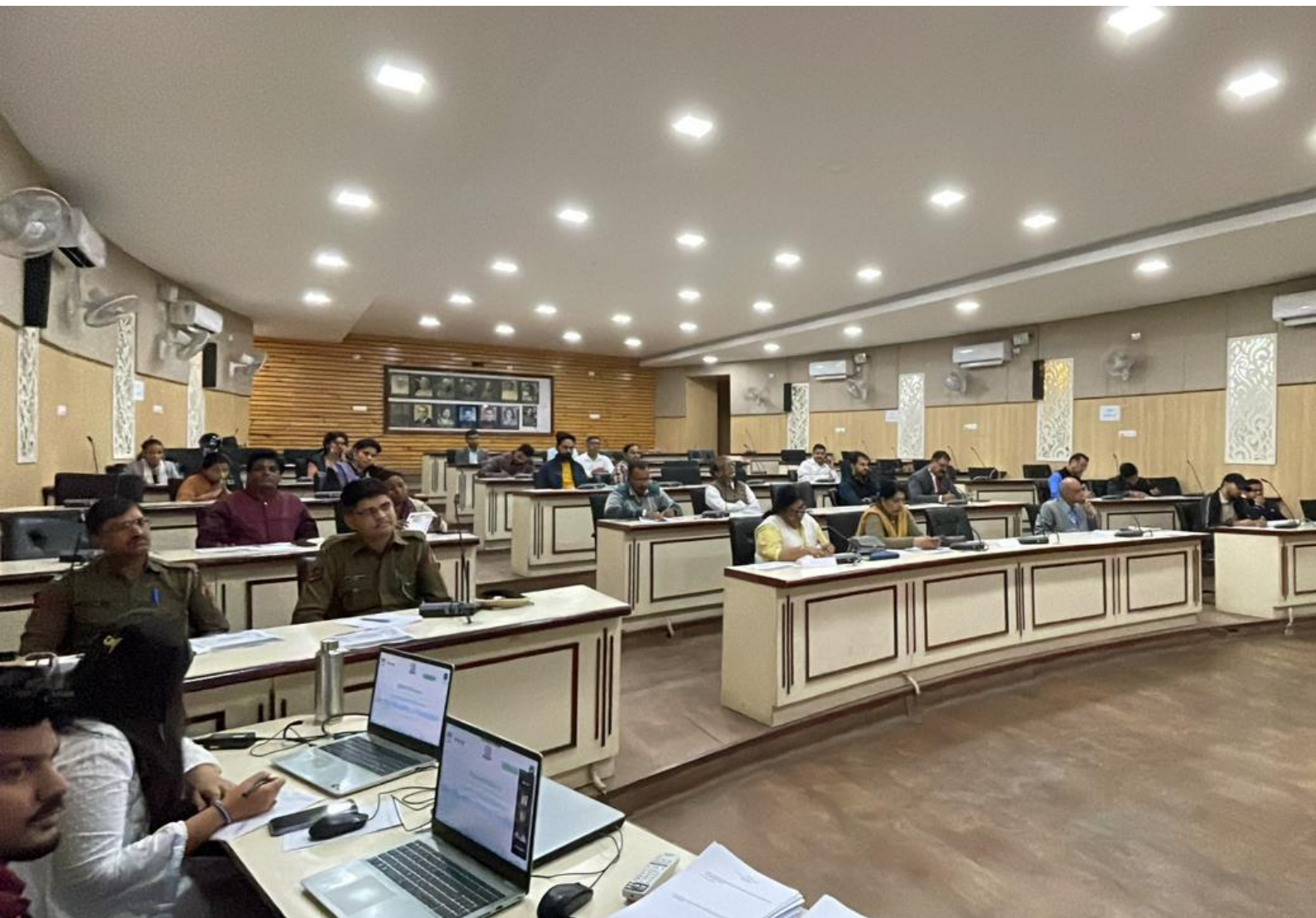

1 Background

Urban95 is BvLF's global initiative, aims to create healthy, prosperous, and vibrant cities where babies, toddlers and their families can thrive. The initiative is meant to make lasting change in the urban landscape and provide opportunities that can shape the crucial first five years of children's lives. The goal of this initiative is to support healthier, safer, and more exciting urban neighbourhoods for young children, for those who care for them, and for everyone.

With the success of Urban95 Phase-I, Udaipur and Pune have now moved into Urban95 Phase-II, focusing on scaling up and sustainability of various projects through implementation of various "lighthouse" projects. Phase II aims to incorporate Urban95 components in policy, enhance institutional capacities through trainings and peer learning workshops and other initiatives.

As a part of Urban95 Phase-II program and its overall scope, it is envisaged to host 5 CBWs spread across entire project duration.

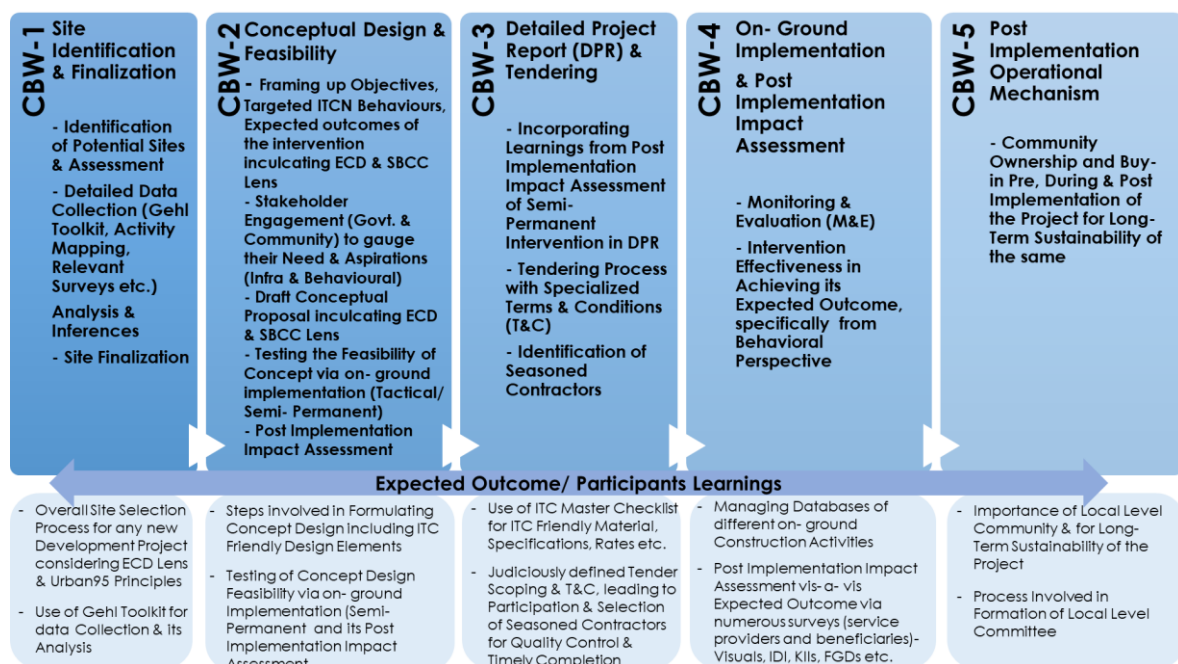


Figure 1 Themes and Expected Outcome of All 5 CBWs

It was decided to tie up all these workshops with each other taking cue from one of the on- going Urban95 project for imparting maximum benefits to the targeted audience, not only in understanding the entire project cycle from inception to its on- ground implementation and its results but also from its long- term sustainability and replicability perspective. Fig 1 showcases the various themes & its expected outcomes.

2 Capacity Building Workshop

As a part of Urban95 Phase-II program and its overall scope, it is envisaged to host 5 Capacity Building Workshops spread across entire project duration, focusing on below mentioned objectives-

- a) Preparing Udaipur in Imbibing Urban95 principles in all the Urban Built Environment Projects/ Activities (New or Retrofit) it undertakes keeping in mind the Needs & Aspirations of Children & their Care- givers, Pregnant and Lactating Women;
- b) Convergence of Urban95 Lens in all the Stakeholders Activities for Scalability and Long- Term Sustainability, enabling Udaipur to transform itself into an Infant, Toddler and their Care- giver (ITC) Friendly City in its true sense;
- c) Capacitate the Technical Knowhow of all the Development Agencies¹ and other Service Providers² & Urban Practitioners- Architects, Urban Planners, NGOs, CBOs, Colleges, Business Houses and Industry (directly and indirectly tied up with govt. agencies such as participating in tenders and taking up on- ground implementation, creation of new facility, infrastructure and/ or O&M of existing facility under CSR etc.), Domain Experts, etc. from Urban95 Lens at various Stages of Projects.

It was decided to involve a mix audience (govt. and non- govt.) to create larger buy- in in the city for increased interest, awareness and participation (technical and financial as well) from non- govt. agencies in the city overall growth and development, using Urban95 principles in convergence of existing projects (if any) and/ or new projects it undertake moving forward.

As mentioned earlier all the workshops are tied up with each other taking cue from one of the on- going Urban95 project for imparting maximum benefits to the targeted audience, not only in understanding the entire project cycle from inception to its on- ground implementation and its results but also from its long- term sustainability and replicability perspective.

In continuation, the 1st Capacity Building Workshop was organized on Thursday, 22nd December 2022 at Board Meeting Room, UMC. Scheduled for 1.5 hours (from 4:00 PM- 5:30 PM), and attended by approx. 60 participants (mix of in- person- 39 nos. and virtually on Zoom Platform- 19 nos.), the workshop stretched for approx. 2 hours, as it turned out to be a highly interactive and engaging workshop.

From M&E perspective, participants feedback were captured from the perspective of attaining information about their expectations and experiences of 1st CBW. This was aimed at improvising the details (if any) from planning & conducting the same for the upcoming workshops and was done through various means such as pre and post survey forms, feedback forms, recorded videos etc.

Below sections impart the workshop details.

Below figure showcase the approach not only for hosting this workshop, but for all the other upcoming CBWs as well.

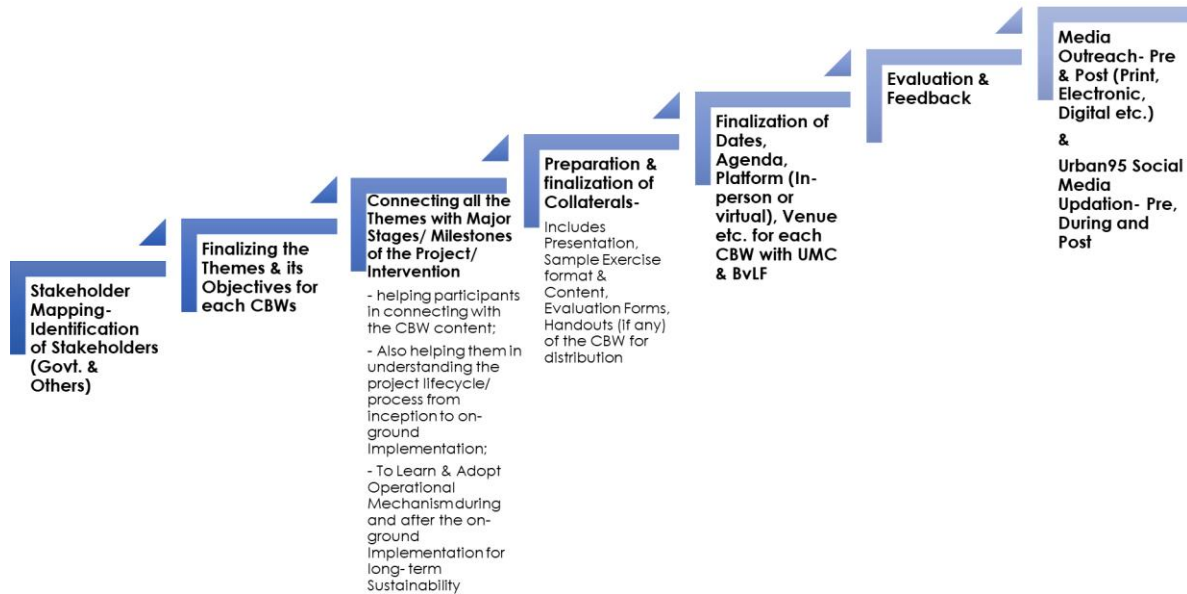


Figure 2 Approach for Conducting the 1st CBW and for the upcoming CBWs as well

2.2 Welcome and Initiation

Chaired by Mrs. Ragini Damor, Dy. Commissioner, UMC, the workshop started with PMU thanking all the participants for attending the same on such a short notice and then proceeding with introducing all the participants in general for everyone to know the variety of participation the workshop has and requesting Dy. Commissioner and DD, ICDS to officially start the workshop.

Dy. Commissioner started with welcoming all the participants and appreciated the Urban95 Team for organizing the workshop and said that if a city is to be made safe, then it is necessary to see it through the eyes of young children. She also remarked that Udaipur has to be developed in a way that young children and their care- givers feel safe when they step out of the house with its parks, streets, and other facilities being designed according to the needs of the young children.

Moreover she also appreciated the team for organizing the workshop with such thoughtful theme and remarked that this shall really help them in understanding the project life cycle from its inception to on- ground implementation to sustainability of the same which will go long way in transforming Udaipur into a Child and their Care- givers Friendly City, in the process making it a lighthouse city for others cities to follow the lead.

DD, ICDS continued the briefing and remarked that she feel very motivated to be a part of the Urban95 program as the program's overall objectives are very much aligned with her vision of bringing change to Anganwadi Centers (AWCs) not only in form of its built environment, which needs to be significantly improved (at par with privately run play

schools) but also from its day- to- day functioning perspective. She continued that the team has her full support in whatever activities it shall undertake in the upcoming project at one of the AWC (Retrofitting of AWC).

2.3 Workshop Presentation

After the welcome, the team started with the presentation in local language not only for the comfort of the participants but also for the reason that it would be an encouraging factor for participants to ask questions in Q&A round (and that exactly has happened) and has explained that all the 5 CBWs are linked with one of the on- going Urban95 project known as 'Children Priority Zone (CPZ)' for the reason that it shall be helpful for all the participants to connect with presentation content and moreover also to understand the entire project lifecycle from its 'Inception to Impact', making it easier for them to understand the entire process and see and feel the results cum impact in real world scenario.

The team also explained that the presentation is divided into two parts, wherein the 1st part talks on the Theme, Objectives and Expected Outcomes of each workshop, followed by the details of 1st workshop theme, i.e. 'Site Identification and Finalization' taking CPZ as a case example.

The team started with the 1st part of the presentation, wherein the team explained the 'importance of right site' for any project not only for imparting maximum benefits to its targeted audience but also for getting the right 'value for money' for the investment made.

The team explained the process of 'Site Identification and Finalization', starting with detailed approach and methodology for the same followed with framing of relevant

parameters and using these parameters for comparative analysis of sites and finalizing one, which fulfills and/ or meet the highest nos. of parameters,

stakeholder discussions, importance of data and various data collection methods and techniques etc.

In continuation, as CPZ was taken as a case example, it was explained in detail including 'Anchor Institute' and 'Catchment of 600M or 20 mins Walk' and the benefits of transforming both by making them interactive, engaging, playful yet safe and how this transformation, if implemented as envisaged, helps in children's overall growth and development.

Moving forward, 2nd part of the workshop, i.e. site selection process for CPZ was explained in detail via CPZ sites, their characteristics including the adjacent land uses, ITCN motivators and barriers, other ITC destinations and stop points, including but not limited to religious places, grocery stores and/ or super markets, neighbourhood parks or any other recreational facility(ies), chowks (public plaza), AWCs, play schools, crèche, Primary Healthcare Centers (PHCs), clinics etc. within the catchment, available facilities and utilities within the catchment and moreover potential and possibility of transforming identified barriers into motivators, making it easier in finalizing the sites.

The team also explained the variations of all the identified sites in form of its income group (HIG, MIG, LIG) and its location, i.e. within and outside the walled city as not only the urban fabric and built environment differs but so do the behavioural practices, social fabric, rituals, traditional practices which ultimately impacts children's overall growth and development as need and aspirations of all the children remains the same irrespective of the background he/ she is coming from.

It was also explained that this was intentionally done to test different models, which then can be replicated to other parts of the city, taking this as a case example. Finally the selected sites were shown based on the comparative analysis of the identified sites vis-à-vis set parameters.

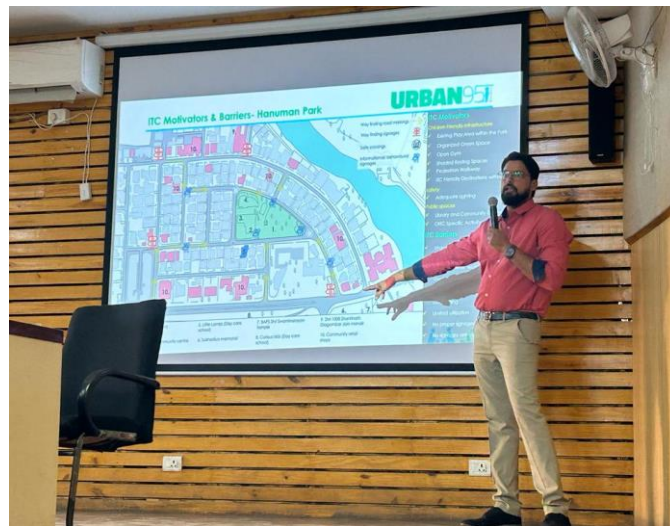


Figure 4 Presentation by PMU Team

2.4 Question and Answer (Q&A) Round

After the presentation, the workshop was open for Q&A, wherein it turned out to be a very interactive and participatory session with questions ranging from **funding of the project(s) to handholding of the development agencies till the implementation to measures for long- term sustainability of the same along with importance of community engagement etc.** were asked and were answered and discussed in detail to the satisfaction of participants.

In- fact one of the participant not only appreciated the **'Traffic Calming Measure outside Vidhya Bhawan Pre-primary School' implemented under Urban95 Phase I, not only from its designing perspective but more so from behaviour change perspective.**

Moreover in between the Q&A round, it was remarked by DD, ICDS that all the questions are

very relevant and important, however most of these

questions shall be part of other CBWs as explained by the team as a part of the workshop themes, objectives and its expected outcomes, hence would be covered in other workshops and requested participants to be part of entire workshop series not only to get these queries answered in the respective workshops in detail but also to get better understanding of entire project cycle.

3 Training Evaluation

The workshop has received very positive feedback, that too on the similar lines of set objectives. This is important from the perspective of attaining information about the participants expectations and experiences of 1st CBW and was aimed at improvising the details (if any) from planning & conducting the same for the upcoming workshops and was done through various means such as pre and post survey forms, feedback forms, recorded videos etc.

A pre and post survey form along with feedback questionnaires form were circulated to all the participants for team to know the current vs post presentation understanding of the participants via 'Quantitative and Qualitative Details'.

The participants were specifically instructed to not fill their personal details (name, designation or organization), placing them at ease to fill in these forms and to receive the right feedback, helping the team in improvising the content or presentation style (if required, based on the responses of the participants on these forms).

The process followed for gathering information on feedback and its importance is as shown below.

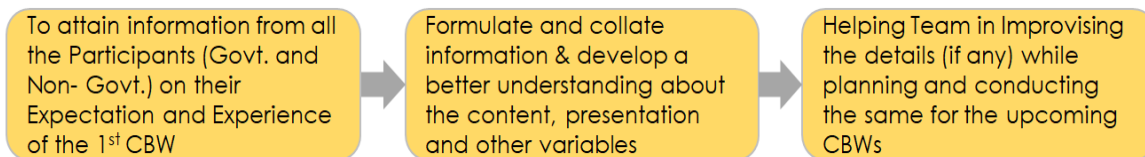


Figure 6 Feedback Process

The subsequent sections details out the excerpts of the workshop feedback, clearly indicating that-

- a) CBW workshop series will go long way in improvising participants understanding of the 'project lifecycle' from its inception to on- ground implementation to its long- term sustainability;
- b) This has also opened the pathways for engaging non- govt. agencies in city's development activities imbibing Urban95 principles, in the process transforming Udaipur into an Urban95 city in true sense;
- c) Has provided a vision on the importance of integrating activities with the learning platforms for enhancing the Early Childhood Development (ECD) and to bring Social Behavior Change in the city;

3.1 Pre and Post Understanding on 'Site Identification and Finalization'

A pre- post form was also prepared and distributed to all the participants to gauge their understanding on 'Site Identification and Finalization' methods and techniques along with importance of Community Engagement etc. and below are the excerpts of the same.

As seen from the below graphs (Figure 9), the post workshop understanding has significant +ve ratings indicating that most of the participants were either unaware of the importance of these methods, techniques or even if they were aware, these were not in their common working practice, but in their post workshop understanding and once they were educated on the importance of these and how this kind of methods and

techniques leads to data driven decision making instead of an ad-hoc approach and/ or decision, they now have shown interest and inclination on importance of various methods and techniques, indicating that from now onwards the same shall be used in their regular working practices.

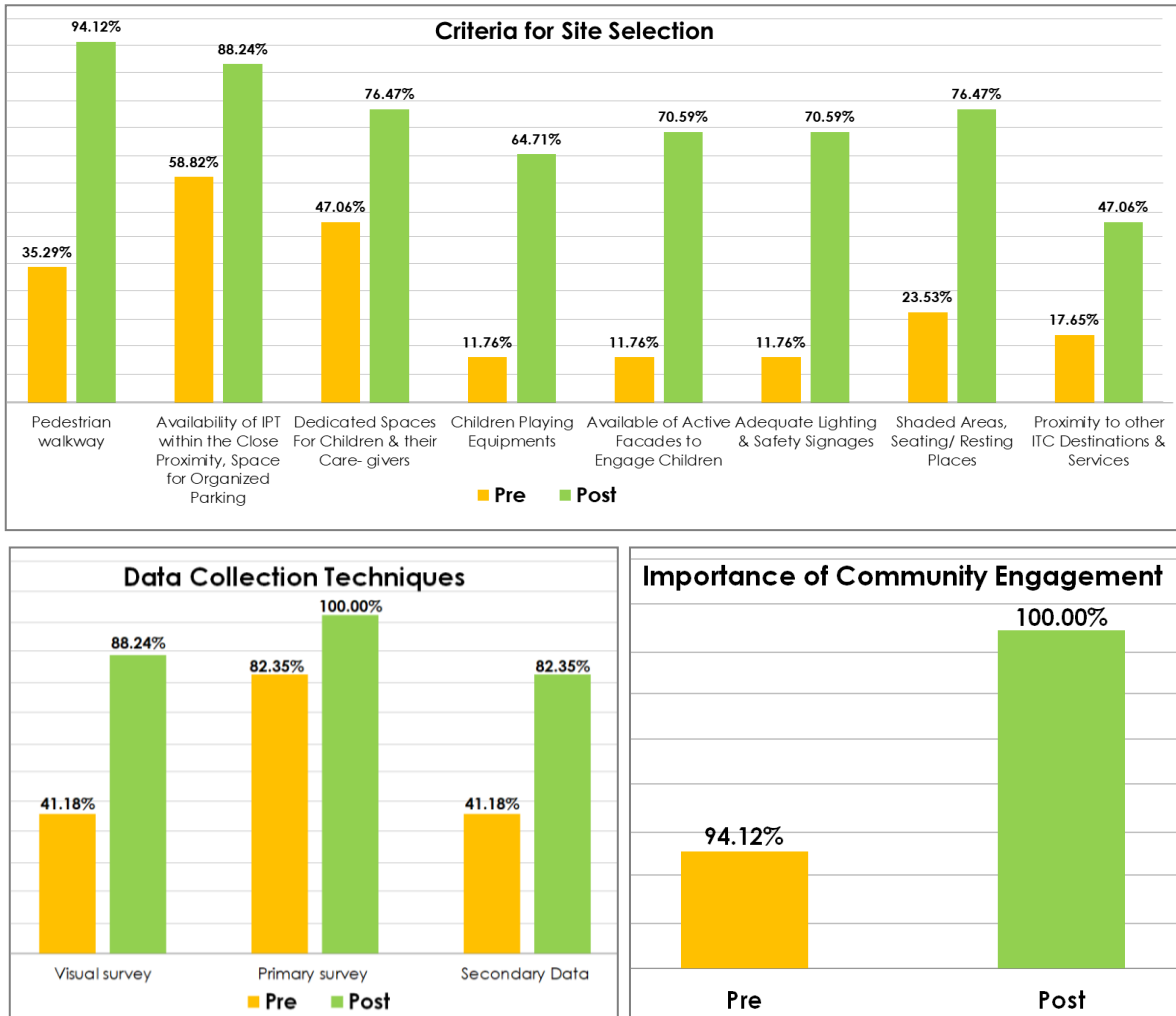


Figure 7 Above- Criteria for Site Selection, Below Left- Data Collection Techniques, Below Right- Importance of Community Engagement

A feedback form was prepared and distributed to all the participants and below are the excerpts of the same.

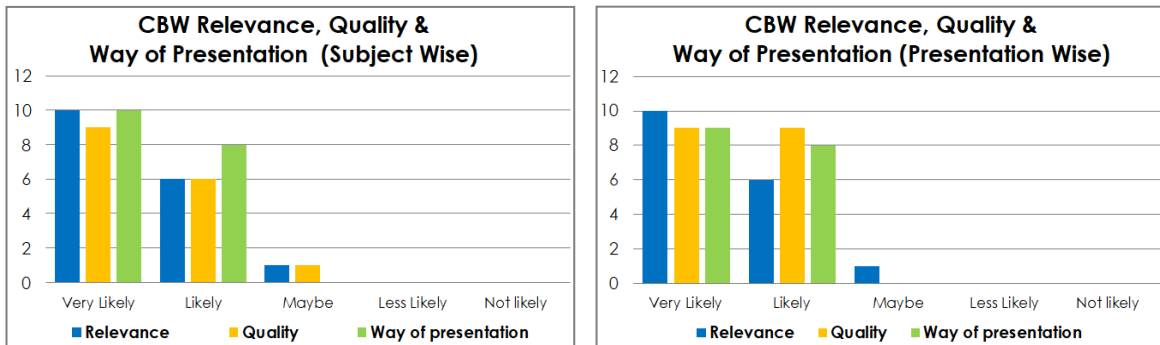


Figure 8 CBW Relevance, Quality & Way of Presentation (Subject and Presentation Wise)

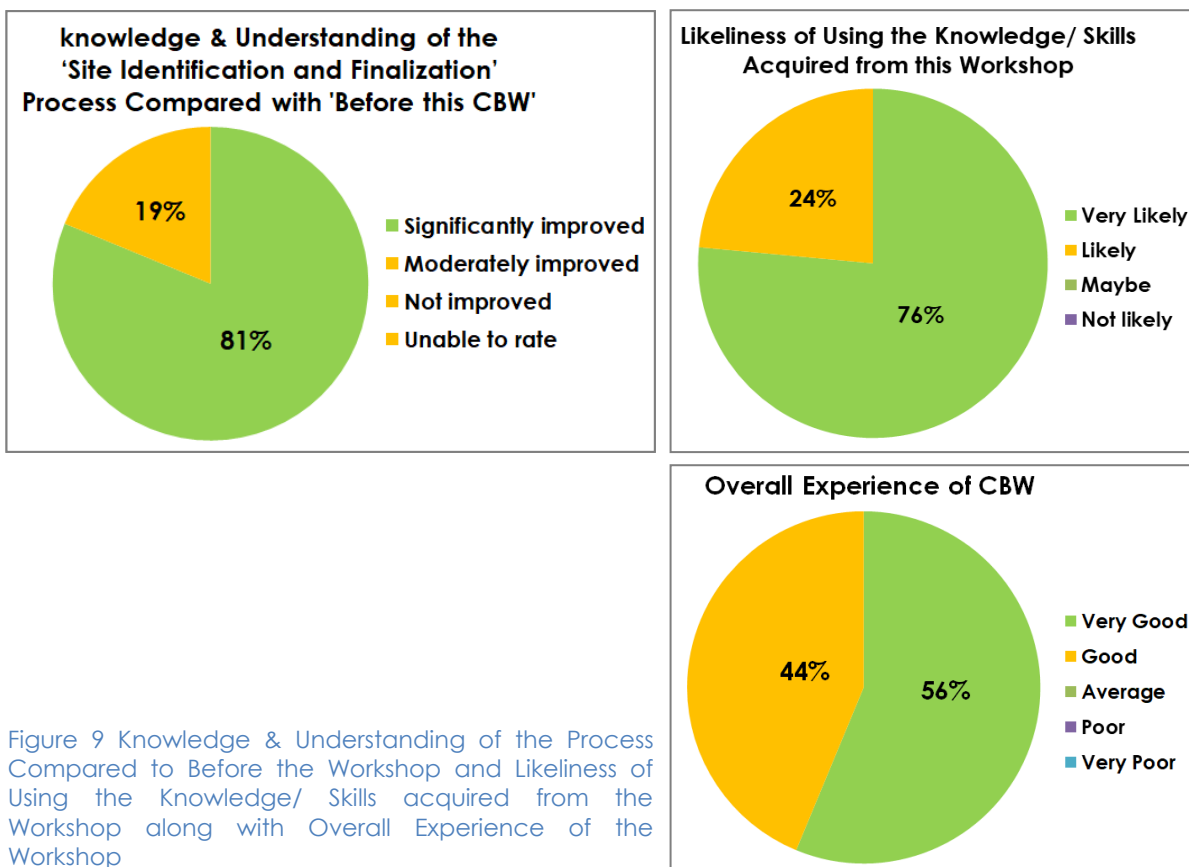


Figure 9 Knowledge & Understanding of the Process Compared to Before the Workshop and Likeliness of Using the Knowledge/ Skills acquired from the Workshop along with Overall Experience of the Workshop

As far as workshop expectations is concerned from participants viewpoint, majorly it came out that:

- a) Participants would like to engage in the process of transforming Udaipur into a Children and their family- friendly City by knowing about the kind of projects/ initiatives city is taking;
- b) Moreover it has also been indicated that if they are aware of the projects/ initiatives they would also like to be a part of the same by providing voluntarily support, which is a big feat for the city given that it shows the city buy- in the city development;
- c) Moreover the importance of 'peer learning' and 'participatory learning' has also been mentioned indicating the importance of such workshops/ sessions and city's interest in becoming part of such sessions.

4 Key Learnings

The team has few important learnings while conducting the 1st CBW and the same are mentioned below which shall be helpful in conducting other such workshop or any other program activities.

1. Organizing such activities by taking cognizance of any upcoming festival, holidays etc. for increased participation, both from govt. and non- govt. organizations. This is based on this workshop, wherein due to year end, lot of participants were on leave or holidays, hence less participation than expected.

In- fact lot of participants has shown interest to be part of this workshop but were unable to attend being out- station due to their planned holidays;

2. Also imperative for team to be aware of any other big activity planned on the same day and timing and then plan the program activities on some other day or timing for increased participation.

Case in point was the 'Nexknos India' workshop, targeted at Architects and Engineers, hosted on the same date and time, hence lot of senior architects of the city had to miss this CBW, even though they had shown enormous interest in attending this workshop. In- fact most of these architects had requested to pre or postpone the same enabling them to attend, but given that it was already confirmed hence couldn't be possible for team to make such changes;

3. Finding ways for wider media coverage and dissemination of program information with UMC support;

5 Way Forward

1. Given the scenario that it turned out be a very interactive session, the team is planning for a 15- 20 mins group exercise from next workshop onwards to make the workshops even more interactive and engaging for participants sustained interest and willingness to be part of other program activities as well for building larger city base moving forward.
2. Moreover as seen from the learning all the other CBWs or any other program activity shall be kept in a way that doesn't clash with any big holidays, festivals and/ or events having similar audience for increased participation from the city.
